Arrests

The team have arrested a number of outstanding suspects who were wanted for various offences.

Neighbourhood Policing

As part of the Modernising Neighbourhood Policing programme, from 2nd June, neighbourhood teams will be restructured into **Dedicated Neighbourhood Officers and Local Action Teams**.

In line with the government's Neighbourhood Policing Guarantee, every ward across the West Midlands will have a named police officer. These officers will focus on three key areas:

Problem solving – tackling persistent local issues through long-term solutions

Targeted activity – proactive interventions to address crime and disorder

Community engagement – building relationships and ensuring residents have a say in policing

As a result of the government funding at least 150 additional police officers and additional Police Community Support Officers (PCSOs) will be joining existing neighbourhood policing teams, demonstrating our commitment to having fully engaged and safer communities.
